A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR MARK KELLAM



This is the final Community Newsletter that I will pen prior to the 2024 Council Election on 14 September. I will not be seeking election for reasons I have spoken publicly about elsewhere.

It has been a privilege to have served our community since 2017 as a Councillor, deputy Mayor and finally as Mayor since the end of 2021. I am immensely proud of the achievements of the Council in the last 2 years and 9 months and those achievements belong to the Council Staff and Councillors whose work made those achievements possible.

I am particularly pleased with the Oberon Library and Community Centre, which was completed in July last year, under the approved budget and on time. This project had its critics, but it has proved to be a marvellous and very popular addition to our community.

The other major project is the Oberon Sporting Complex which is under construction and is currently ahead of schedule. There are many other projects detailed in the business papers of the 12 August Ordinary Meeting Papers which are available through the Council Website (www.oberon.nsw.gov.au) Link to the delivery plan-

The major reform which was achieved was the Town Improvement Levy which was abolished, and the equivalent rating and expenditure made equitable across the whole LGA. This has been the only rate reform in our LGA for 85 years.

I have had several people, and organisations ask me what makes a good councillor and who should they vote for. I am not going to recommend or advocate for any particular candidate but there are some attributes worth looking for as you consider who will get your vote.

Local Government is complex and requires Councillors to be able to deal with this complexity when making decisions. Good analytical skills and critical thinking are important.

Any good candidate must demonstrate their ability and motivation to contribute broadly to the running of the council. In the case of single-issue candidates there is a tendency to be one dimensional and focus on that issue to the detriment of other very important aspects of Council business.

Councillors need to be able to put personal preferences aside in evaluating the worth of any proposition focusing only on the viability of a proposition and value to the community.

For at least the last decade there has been a very conservative approach to finances and borrowings. Maintaining a balanced budget and only borrowing for capital works. This approach has served the community well and remains a good approach to maintaining financial stability.

Consider your votes carefully. But in my view, versatile and committed all-rounders make for the best and most effective Council.



A "win win" for Oberon District Museum and Oberon U3A



Over the past 6 years an active group of U3A members have been engaged in restoration projects at the local museum. Originally called the Heritage Machinery Restoration group, but now fondly known as the "Rusty Restorers", they meet every Wednesday

morning at the Oberon Museum to work on all kinds of machinery and other items that are in need of restoration and repair. The photos below show some of the Rusties working on a small dray and another pair working to restore a tractor donated to the museum by Neville Kurtz. Other projects have included the construction of a small "outhouse" to display a Hygeia Dissolvenator (an early model toilet!), the repainting of the big steam engine (which can be seen from Lowes Mount Road), the restoration of a horse-drawn chaffcutter and a hay steamer, as well as the "sprucing up" of many smaller objects inside the pavilions.

The members involved in the work come from all sorts of backgrounds – retired fitters and turners, boilermakers, mechanics, farmers, accountants – the only real requirement is that they are willing to have a go! Being a bit "handy" is probably a good asset as well!

Council is aware of a print house error on the reverse side of the 2024/2025 Annual Waste Vouchers. There is a \$10 value stated on the voucher, which should not have been included. All waste vouchers permit up to one ute load or standard 6'x4' trailer of domestic waste, excluding mattresses, lounges and tyres.

Due to the complexities and potential confusion associated with reissuing, Council has made the decision to continue utilising the current vouchers and ask the community to disregard the monetary value stated.

Council acknowledge there has been public commentary regarding this issue. Staff are working with the print house to investigate how this error occurred and rectification avenues available to Council. Work will continue in pursuing this matter.



OTHR FUNDING BOOST

The hard-working team at the Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway have received some great news. I recently let the team of volunteers know they would receive support from the NSW Government Community Building Partnership fund to the tune of \$20,354.

This grant is in recognition of the dedication of the OTHR volunteers, and the funding will allow them to purchase a rail saw, dog spike puller, dog screw installer and some new items for their small kitchen area.

These are costly, specialist and invaluable tools for the OTHR members whose vision is to bring one of the region's most picturesque rail lines back into operation as a local and regional tourist attraction. Their ultimate aim is to restore the Oberon Tarana branch line which is some 24.3km long

and was originally built between 1921 and 1923.

The Community Building Partnership fund is a NSW Government initiative which awards grants for community infrastructure projects that deliver positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks and gratitude to Peter Ryan as he recently retired from Fire and Rescue NSW. Peter was the longest serving operational firefighter in the history of Fire and Rescue NSW.
