On a broader level, I recently attended the Central West NSW Joint Organisation (CNSWJO) Board Meeting and Conference, where regional leaders discussed shared priorities for growth and sustainability for our regions. I also had the opportunity to meet with the Premier and Ministers, advocating for the needs of our community and exploring opportunities to strengthen Oberon's future. There will be challenges ahead in 2025 for all of us and your Council will have some difficult decisions to address, but I am certain with our diverse range of capabilities we are in a position to meet those challenges.

# **Central West NSW Joint Organisation Board Meeting**

The General Manager and I attended the Central NSW Joint Organisation Board Meeting in Sydney on Wednesday 13 November and Thursday 14 November. The representatives from across the Joint Organisation met with Ministers on Thursday 14 November to discuss areas of regional importance. Specifically, issues of major importance to Oberon were as follows:

Pest Control - The Natural Resource Commission (NRC) has published an interim report on Pest and Weeds Biosecurity in NSW recommending governments consideration of bringing the two biosecurity functions, pest animals and Weeds, much closer together. Concurrently Dr. Marion Healy, the newly appointed Biosecurity Commissioner in NSW has commenced a review of the Governance function for Invasive species in NSW focused on Pests and Weeds. The Minister for Agriculture, Tara Moriarty, said it was not planned at this stage to have the Pest function transferred to Local Councils/County Councils. The report is interim, and she expects many substantive submissions on it. Dr Healy is meeting with Central Tablelands Weeds Authority on Wednesday 20 November to seek input for her review into weed control processes and methodologies in NSW. I thanked the NSW Government for the extra \$13 million that had been allocated by the State Government for wild pig control but noted the problem was in plague proportions throughout the State. The Minister acknowledged the issue. Mayor of Lachlan, John Medcalfe suggested a snout bounty be introduced to encourage shooters to kill pigs and in particular to shoot pigs of all sizes not just large ones.

Contribution by State Government to Renewable Energy Zones (REZs) - The NSW Government has indicated it will contribute \$128 million to REZs for upgrading roads and compensating communities for the dislocation caused by Renewable Energy projects.

I asked Stephen Lawrence, the Labour MLC responsible for the Central West, why Councils where the State Government had directed Forestry Corporation to investigate constructing windfarms should not be treated similarly with State Government funding for roads and community dislocation?

Connectivity to Sydney - The perpetual issue of connectivity for passenger and freight to Sydney via rail and road was raised including the issues with the rail freight curfew during the day. Landslides blocking the Great Western Highway (GWH) and western rail line were also discussed. It was suggested a long-term vision for a solution was required. The Premier indicated its current projects in Sydney for rail were well over budget and close to double the original price, so this was hampering any future plans for the Blue Mountains. There has also been a significant redistribution of GST revenue which has substantially reduced NSW share and therefore the state was hampered without Federal Govt funding for any solution. Minister Atchison stated a white paper is coming out next year for consultation with all stakeholders including Blue Mountains residents on future strategies for the GWH.

**Jenolan Caves -** The issue of the closure of Jenolan Caves was raised with Minister Atchison, the Minister for Regional Roads, and its effect on Oberon Tourist businesses. The Edith Road connection to the Caves is currently scheduled for reopening to tourist traffic in March 2026. Even then the available carparks at Jenolan Caves will not be nearly sufficient for the potential though put of visitors to the Caves upon reopening. The Minister was asked to consider additional strategies for access to the Caves to ensure that both Jenolan Caves and Oberon could benefit from increased daily numbers of tourists to this facility. She indicated some strategies had been suggested and were being investigated.

Volunteers and committee members are now focusing on the next phase of works which includes gaining accreditation to run trains on the restored line.







### WORK COMPLETE ON OBERON TO HAZELGOVE RAIL LINE! BRING ON THE LOCOMOTIVES!

Recently I joined members of the Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway to celebrate the completion of 5.5 kilometres of upgraded rail trackwork between Oberon and Hazelgrove.

This is a stunning achievement by members of the Heritage Railway and was made possible by a \$1.5 million Federal Government grant I secured in 2019. It represents years of hard work and commitment from Heritage Railway members, with numerous obstacles overcome.

Many said that this couldn't be done but Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway is no ordinary organisation! Once State Government approvals are in place, the Heritage Railway will begin taking visitors up and down the line in their vintage carriages nulled by diesel

vintage carriages pulled by diesel locomotives, which is very exciting!

I have no doubt that Oberon will become a hugely popular destination for train and rail enthusiasts from around Australia and the world!

The re-opening of the line will showcase our rich rail history while at the same time providing a massive tourism boost to Oberon and the region. I can't wait! A big congratulations to Heritage Railway president, Greg Bourne and his committee for all their hard work!

aren't being replaced.

Some of our towns no longer have any GPs at all.

It's an outrageous fact that the further you live from the city, the shorter your life expectancy. Country people deserve the same access to health services as those living in the cities, and that's something that I will continue to fight for.

Our medical practices have requested that the Health Minister now visit the region to witness this crisis for himself. I'm calling on him to come here on the double.

### PINES WIND FARM UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who has met with me or contacted my office about the proposed Pines wind farm.

I've had a lot of productive conversations and site visits around the district.

While there are people for and against the proposal, my take on the situation is that the majority of local residents are either against it, or have serious reservations about it. There is genuine concern from residents who are potentially directly impacted. I'm not opposed to renewable energy, however Stromlo has not been able to carry enough community support in the way it's gone about this.

I've therefore decided that I won't be supporting it.

# NO TO MISINFORMATION AND DISINFORMATION BILL

The Government's Communications Legislation Amendment (Combatting Misinformation and Disinformation) Bill 2024 was recently debated in Parliament.

I spoke and voted against it because of serious concerns I have about its impacts on free speech.

Having a government agency like the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) decide what is misinformation and disinformation on social media and other platforms is a recipe for government censorship and would create a minefield in terms of free speech. So it was a no from me.
