Mayoral Message

A message from the new Mayor, Councillor Andrew McKibbin



On Tuesday 15 October 2024, I was elected as Mayor of Oberon for the text two years by my fellow Councillors and Councillor Katie Graham was elected Deputy Mayor. I can assure all Oberon and surrounding residents that I understand the responsibilities of the mayoral role and will undertake those responsibilities to the best of my ability.

The community now has a new and enthusiastic Council. I congratulate Councillor Katie Graham on her election as the Deputy Mayor and look forward to working closely with her. Councillors Lauren Trembath, Clive McCarthy, Helen Hayden and

Ian Tucker are all returning Councillors and we welcome our new Councillors Frank O'Connor, Jill O'Grady and Tony Alevres. I congratulate and look forward to working with all Councillors over the next two years and to deliver on the many and varied projects close to the hearts of the Oberon Community.

The finalisation of the new Oberon Sporting Complex and the delivery of a new Oberon Sewerage Treatment Plant are crucial to the future development of Oberon. The potential future construction of windfarms and associated infrastructure within our Council area has become contentious within our community. These projects are subject to State Government approval, not Council. However, Council needs to be in a position to ensure Oberon's interests are protected.

During this term, the new Comprehensive Land Use Strategy will be developed by Council with considerable Community involvement, and this will guide development opportunities over the next ten years in our Council area. The community needs to consider what development controls they require in their villages, on rural land and in the Oberon Township.

Our Council is united in assisting with community programs such as the End of Year Spectacular, our significant Section 356 Donations Program as well as ongoing annual events including Australia Day, Seniors Lunch, International Women's Day and Youth events to name just a few.

Tourism initiates such as the Field to Forest and Oberon Outdoors Festivals continue to draw tourists to our Council area and will continue to be supported by your Council.

There are significant ongoing issues that affect Oberon such as the Forestry Corporation unrateable land, funding for regional and rural communities, transport across the Blue Mountains and access into Jenolan Caves. Council will continue to lobby, question and pursue State and Federal Governments on these issues.

I look forward to talking with any member of the Community over the next two years to understand the driving issues that motivate our community.

Remembrance Day -11 November 2024

It was at 11am on November 11, 1918, that the guns finally fell silent on the Western Front after four years of war.

It was a conflict that left between nine and 13 million dead, many of which have no grave, and many nations war-weary. It was this monumental moment in time that is commemorated on Remembrance Day.

On the 11th hour, on the 11th day, of the 11th month, one minute's silence is observed and dedicated to those soldiers who died fighting to protect the nation.

This year Remembrance Day will again be commemorated in Oberon and will take place on Monday, 11 November 2024.

The service, which the Oberon RSL Sub Branch will conduct, will begin at 10.50am at the Oberon War Memorial.

The service will be followed by refreshments and lunch at the RSL Club.

The Oberon community is invited to attend the service.

All former Australian Defence Force personnel and war widows are invited to lunch at the club. The wider community are also welcome to join us for lunch for a small fee.


Oberon RSL Sub Branch members will be selling poppies and badges in the main street on Friday and Saturday, November 8 and 9.

SQUASH COURTS UPGRADED

Squash players will now be playing on two flash new courts thanks to the NSW Government's 2022 Community Building Partnership Program which provided a \$30,000 grant to refurbish the facilities at the Oberon RSL. This is fantastic news for the Oberon community who use this facility daily and it's great to see the work completed.

The Oberon Squash Club holds individual and team competitions for adults and children alike to socialise and enjoy the fast-paced game of squash. This grassroots funding has helped create a more modern and up to date facility that will keep squash players at the top of their game here in Oberon.

I congratulate all the organisations that were successful in their application and know that projects such as this make a real difference for community groups in the area.



SPORTING HUB TAKES SHAPE

It's great to see real progress on Oberon's new sporting complex.

This visionary project on a greenfield site promises to be a

game-changer for the local community and I am proud to have played a major role in securing support from the NSW Government to help make this happen.

Residents will have noticed that major earthworks are well underway on an eight hectare parcel of land which will ultimately pave the way for the relocation of the Oberon Tigers who will make this sporting hub their new headquarters.

The sporting complex features two rugby league fields, three netball courts, a clubhouse, spectator seating, and amenities. It is envisaged that future stages could include the addition of a synthetic hockey field.

A project of this importance and enormity does not happen overnight and has been in the pipeline for many years after I was able to announce back in 2019 a \$2 million grant to kickstart the development.

It should also be noted that an additional \$4.8 million was also made available to ensure work could proceed in delivering a multi-sports complex that would serve the region for decades to come.

I look forward to seeing work continue as quickly as possible and in doing so create a sporting precinct that we can all be proud of.








Planning Ahead – Free Workshops open to the community

Have you made a Will? Have you organised a Power of Attorney and Legal Guardianship? Have you thought about making an Advance Care Directive?

If your answer is "No" then think about attending a "Planning Ahead" workshop run by Melanie Lawson and Glen Stewart on Wednesday, November 6 between 10.00am and noon, at the Oberon Library / Community Centre. The workshop will include practical information and resources on Powers of Attorney, Enduring Guardianship, Wills and Advance Care Plans, as well as what to do when someone dies e.g. dealing with financial issues, contacting institutions and finding information. Melanie currently works for the Oberon Neighbourhood Centre and is a social worker with a background in aged care, disability and guardianship, and Glen, who has a background in banking and financial counselling, is currently working for Mary McKillop Today.

As well as this workshop, Glen has offered to run three more one-hour financial workshops on Wednesdays in November and December. These are also open to any interested community members. They are:

Managing Christmas Spending (develop habits to avoid overspending; money management & budgeting) November 13, 11.00am – noon Oberon Library / Community Centre

Scams (Including issues emerging with Artificial Intelligence) November 27, 11.00am – noon, Oberon Library / Community Centre

Dealing with Debt (how to avoid debt traps; what to do when debt becomes unmanageable, and where to go for help) December 11, 11.00am – noon, Oberon Library / Community Centre These free workshops have been organized by Oberon U3A and are open to the whole community. Do come along. No need to book.
